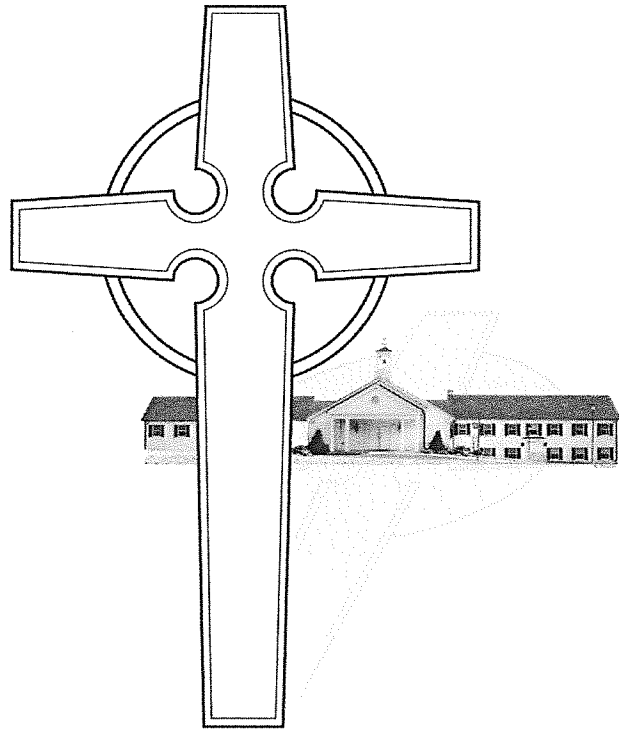

Prayers of Confession and Reconciliation

of grace and compassion. In the name of Jesus, the Prince of Peace we pray.

Litany of Gifts

One: There are varieties of gifts,

Statement on Ordination and Installation

Presentation of Candidate

Elder

Representing the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic church, the session of the Presbyterian Church of Deep Run now ordains Sam Garnick to the office of Deacon.

Renunciations

One: Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?

Deacon: I do.

One: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Lord and Savior, trusting in his grace and love?

Deacon: I do.

One: Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his Word and showing his love?

Deacon: I will, with God's help.

Apostle's Creed

Elder

One: With the whole church, let us confess our faith. Do you believe in God, the Father almighty?

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

One: Do you believe in Jesus Christ?

All: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

One: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

**All: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
Amen.**

Constitutional Questions to the Candidate

One: Do you trust in Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Deacon: I do.

One: Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you?

Deacon: I do.

One: Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Deacon: I do and I will.

One: Will you fulfill your office in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions?

Deacon: I will.

One: Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Deacon: I will.

One: Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Deacon: I will.

One: Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

Deacon: I do.

One: Will you seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?

Deacon: I will.

One: (To Deacon): Will you be a faithful deacon, teaching charity, urging concern, and directing the people's help to the friendless and those in need? In your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

Deacon: I will.

Questions to the Congregation

Elder

One: Do we, the members of the church, accept Sam Garnick, as a Deacon chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ?

All: We do.

One: Do we agree to encourage him, to respect his decisions, and to follow as Sam guides us, serving Jesus Christ who alone is Head of the Church?

All: We do.
